

Sports Premium 2017-18

INTRODUCTION

At Frinton on Sea Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision by: buying in Sports Coaches, purchasing new sports equipment, extending our outside areas to develop outdoor learning experiences, entering into more competitive sports competitions and further training our staff to deliver quality PE sessions.

OBJECTIVES FOR SPORTS PREMIUM IN THIS SCHOOL

- A lifelong positive attitude to exercise and a healthy lifestyle
- Booking sport activities for Sports week.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport.
- Opportunities for sportsmanship, fair play and equality for all
- Physical skills for sporting opportunities across their Primary education and beyond
- An opportunity to experience success beyond the academic area
- Outdoor Learning (equipment, training, and resources)

ACCOUNTABILITY

The Executive Head Teacher together with the Senior Leadership Team will regularly monitor, evaluate and review the strategies we have put into place for Sports Premium and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact. This will be part of the regular monitoring during **half termly** Sports Premium meetings

SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING

- In the current financial year (2017/18) the school should receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil. There is also a carry forward from 2016/17 of £1,700 to be allocated.

STRATEGY FOR USING THE FUNDING

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the School Games

Impact:

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation and provision mapping arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve

the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school. Assessments are made both formally and informally using our school assessment systems as well as feedback from staff and visitors to the school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE.

OUTCOMES AS A RESULT OF SPORTS PREMIUM

- Attendance is currently 96.2% which is a further increase on last year
- Pupils have complete resources to enable them to participate in a range of P.E. activities
- Particular groups of children have experienced visiting sports Coaches including Kick Boxing sessions
- SEMH children have experienced lunchtime clubs and fitness kick Boxing sessions to develop their emotional wellbeing
- PNI/ Disabled children have been to specialised sporting activities-
- KS1 have had access to a Multi Skills club, Good News Club, both were highly attended and KS2 have had access to football, Cross Country, Cricket, Netball and Athletics
